VETERINARY FELLOWSHIP

- Support of up to \$66,000 annually to Tuskegee University's College of Veterinary Medicine
- An orientation to the Program and the Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service
- Two summer internships, one at the Service in the summer of 2022 and one overseas in the summer of 2023.
- Mentoring from Foreign Service Officers
- Employment in the USDA APHIS Foreign Affairs Office to study applicable law and USDA policy, for the duration of the program and meet Foreign Service requirements

Eligibility Requirements

- U.S. citizenship
- Must be matriculated in Tuskegee University's College of Veterinary Medicine, having completed at least one year of study by the time of the application deadline.
- Must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.2 or higher on a 4.0 scale at the time of application
